SIDEWALK MAINTENANCE

The City of Moncton understands the importance of regular sidewalk maintenance and upkeep in order to ensure the safety of our citizens, in particular, our seniors. Your seniors committee meets regularly with City officials to ensure that safety remains a priority!

GARBAGE COLLECTION

The City now operates under a **wet / dry separation system** for garbage collection. Please separate your wet and dry items into the appropriate blue or green bags. If you have questions about the wet / dry system, or need to know what night your garbage is picked up, contact **853-3333**.

PARKS

Moncton has four beautiful parks which feature trails that are open and groomed year-round! **Riverfront Park** features a trail that follows the Petitcodiac River; **Mapleton** and **Irishtown parks** are heavily treed and allow you to enjoy a nature-based environment; and **Centennial Park** has a number of different trails and activities to choose from. All four parks have ample parking and are safe for walking and cycling:

Public Transportation

CODIAC TRANSIT

is the City of Moncton's main public transit provider. A **monthly pass**, at a discounted rate is available for seniors.

ABILITY TRANSIT

transportation service is accessible and available to persons with significant mobility restrictions.

This service operates from Monday to Saturday.

Protection Services

RCMP (Police)

Codiac Regional RCMP are responsible for safety and security in the City of Moncton. In an **emergency**, dial **911** immediately. For **non-emergency** related safety concerns, contact the RCMP at **857-2400**.

SENIORS REGISTRY

During a crisis or emergency, seniors who are living alone are often the most at risk. The registry allows seniors to submit their name and contact information to the Moncton Fire Department. In the event of an emergency, Moncton firefighters will contact the people listed on the registry to ensure that everyone is safe.
